ABOUT ELLIOT & ME

In the early 2000's, Elliot & Steven Willensky began to talk about fulfilling a lifelong dream—creating a musical of Elliot's songs featured between humorous family stories and adventures. In 2010, work began in earnest on Elliot & Me and after 10 years of development, Hudson Theatre Works is proud to stage the world premiere of this enchanting musical.

The real life brothers were born 10 years apart and they developed a very special bond that grew and had been tested over

the years. *Elliot & Me* chronicles their lives and unfolds via a two man show. Elliot is a charming, free-spirited ladies' man overflowing with talent, *joie de vivre*, and a knack for driving Steven crazy. The brothers reflect on the volatile ups and downs of their shared experiences: from their raucous "wonder years" growing up in Bayonne, NJ; to the painful conflict when Elliot defies the expectations of his traditional middle-class Jewish family and drops out of medical school; to Elliot's rise to stardom writing hits for the likes of Michael Jackson, Smokey Robinson, and Whitney Houston; to Steven's starry-eyed admiration for his Hollywood lifestyle and, eventually, to their role reversals when Elliot's career hits a few bumps in the road and needs to rely on Steven for help. There are many layers and unexpected twists and turns in the book written Scott Coulter and Steven Willensky: the love story of brothers, the unmet parental expectations when neither son becomes a doctor, the fine line between success and failure, the willingness to take risks to fulfill dreams, and ultimately the brothers' realization of what is really important in life.

In addition to eight original numbers, the musical features many of Elliot's hit songs arranged by Michael Holland including the haunting *I'm My Brother's Keeper, We've Got Forever, The Singer,* and mega hits *If You Say My Eyes Are Beautiful* and *Got to Be There*.

Drew Seigla* (Steven) Richmond, VA native Drew Seigla is a standout among theatre and opera audiences, recognized for his "stunning tenor voice" by Broadway World.com. He made his Off-Broadway debut as Matt; The Mute in The Fantasticks where he continued for a solid two-year stint. He gained his second NYC credit after joining the cast of Sweeney Todd as their Standby Anthony/ Tobias/Beadle at Barrow St. Theatre. Regional Theatre highlights include Kiss me Kate at Flat Rock Playhouse & Jack in Into the Woods at Barksdale Theatre. Before returning to NYC in 2014 he made his opera debut with Lyric Opera Virginia, where he sang Gastone & covered Alfredo in La Traviata. Seigla was last seen as Pertshik in Fiddler on the Roof in Yiddish at Stage 42, directed by theatre legend, Joel Grey. Drew holds a B.M. from The Juilliard School, and studied Music Theatre at Elon University. Thanks to God, Mom and Dad, Steph, Michael, my friends & teachers. @drewseigla

Steven S. Willensky (Co-Writer, Conceiver and Producer) could often be spotted playing and singing at piano bars during his college days. However, after receiving an MBA from Northwestern, he spent the next 32 years as a corporate executive at GE, Medex, and American Greetings. During that time, Steven was advisor, confidant, and financial supporter to Elliot. Whenever in the same city, they would often perform duets of Elliot's songs at clubs and bars. Steven also collaborated with Elliot by coming up with the title and writing several lyrics to "Some Things Never Change". The brothers frequently talked about developing a two-man show together. Steven would write the book and Elliot would supply the music. Elliot tragically passed away during the concept phase, but Steven moved forward with the dream and helped create and produce "Elliot and Me". Steven currently serves on the boards of several startup companies and nonprofit organizations and is CEO of Woodstock Theater Group.

Scott Coulter (Co-writer book), star of the Emmy-nominated "A Christmas Carol: The Concert" on PBS, is one of New York's most honored vocalists and an Emmy nominee himself for "American Song." He regularly performs with legendary artists including Stephen Schwartz, Tony-winner Ben Vereen and Grammy-winner Sheena Easton. Schwartz has said, "One of the greatest things that can happen to a composer is to have his music interpreted by Scott Coulter." He performs with symphonies all over the world and has created many touring concert events including "Music of the Knights," "Blockbuster Broadway,""The Wonderful Music of Oz" and, with The ASCAP Foundation, "Jerry Herman: The Broadway Legacy Concert." Scott is director of original programming at Feinstein's/54 Below and artistic director of the Pocono Mountains Music Festival. He's the owner/founder of Spot-On Entertainment (www.spotonentertainment.com) and Spot-On Arts Academy and a proud graduate of University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music.

Elliot Willensky (Music & Lyrics) was an American composer, lyricist and music producer. His compositions were recorded by superstars Tony Orlando and Dawn, The 5th Dimension, Chaka Kahn, Charlene, Smokey Robinson, Gladys Knight, Kim Fields, Syreeta Wright, Thelma Houston, and Jerry Butler. He had hit records with Michael Jackson: "Dear Michael", "We've Got Forever" and the #1 smash single, "Got to Be There". His Whitney Houston/Jermaine Jackson duet of "If You Say My Eyes Are Beautiful" was released on three albums including Whitney's Greatest Hits. People Magazine ranks it as one of the Top 10 Wedding Songs or the 90's and was a recurring theme song on "As the World Turns". Elliot composed the music for the Off-Broadway "Abby's Song", as well as the "Beaver Creek Rendezvous" for Holland American Cruise Lines. Elliot wrote theme songs for the movies Mr. Atlas and The Karen Ann Quinlan Story, jingles for Hertz and Braniff Airlines, and was musical coordinator for the Tony Orlando Variety show on CBS.

Michael Holland (Musical Arranger) was orchestrator/vocal arranger/recording co-producer for the Broadway revival of Godspell. In 2019 he served as Music Director/Orchestrator/Vocal Arranger for Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park's acclaimed production of You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown. His original score for Clue: A New Comedy (Cleveland Playhouse, 2020) will be published by Broadway Licensing in 2021. As composer/
